New Allotment and Cemetries Officer

As I am sure some of you are aware, we have a new Allotment Officer, Tim Mellor. Tim has been regularly visiting the Jockey Lane and Underwood Road sites, getting to know lots of the Allotment holders, listening to any concerns or questions and addressing any problems where he can.

Rent Increase

Due to inflation and the Cost of Living increase, the allotment rents will be increasing this year. The new rent will increase from $\pounds10.00$ to $\pounds12.00$ per rod with the reduced rate rising from $\pounds6.50$ to $\pounds8.00$ per rod.



Sewall Drive

We have currently closed the waiting list to new applicants for Sewall Drive due to the delays in the developer handing it over to the Borough Council. When that eventually happens we will be allowed to put the finishing touches to the site. All those currently on the waiting list will have their first year's rent free, and the Parish Council will also provide free soil improver during the first year.



Bow Lake Gardens

We have also closed the waiting list for the Bow Lake Gardens allotments. Experts consulted by the Parish Council have indicated that there are significant problems with the site being used for allotments and we are currently working with the Borough Council to determine the best path forward. If those on the waiting list wish it, we are happy to offer them a plot at the nearby Sewall Drive when it opens, or at Underwood Road where the waiting time is currently under 6 months.

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATES

Parish Council Grants

Since the start of April this year, the Parish has awarded grants to:

- Eastleigh Borough and Romsey Mencap £1,000 to support the Dance Club hire of a venue and teacher (Blue Butterfly Studios)
- Friends of In Touch £400 for sports equipment, coaching and healthy snacks at their weekly sessions working with children with Autistic Spectrum Conditions in the Borough of Eastleigh.
- Life Education Wessex and Thames Valley (Helping Children Make Healthy Choices) £430 to provide and Educator and Resources to visit Stoke Park Junior School, Years 3 and 4.
- Itchen Navigation Preservation Trust £1221.67 to provide 200m of low dog proof fencing to create and protect a conservation area in reedbeds alongside the public footpath and River Itchen.

Bee and Tree Corridor

Earlier this year, Eastleigh Borough Council started their Bee and Tree Corridor. The Tree and Bee Corridor connects woodlands and biodiversity through a series of living "stepping stones" across the landscape. These stepping stones, ranging from roadside wildflowers to edible forest gardens, provide essential food and shelter for wildlife, aiding their movement between habitats. They are planning to plant in areas like school grounds, roundabouts, and community gardens, enhancing green spaces and restoring hedgerows to create a thriving, connected environment.



We have had a lot of comments from people about the verges in the Parish which have been used as trial areas for the project. A lot of you are saying they look overgrown and don't appear to be being maintained. Please continue to let us have any questions or comments and we will pass them on to Eastleigh Borough Council.

We only print on FSC accredited paper from sustainable sources. These are monitored by the Forestry Stewardship Council to ensure sustainability. We don't print on recycled stock which can be harmful to the environment because harmful chemicals and bleaching agents can be used in the recycling process.
