# **Ref: Your presentation to the Bishopstoke Parish Council Planning Committee** on 28<sup>th</sup> September 2021

Dear Stuart,

Thank you for coming to the Planning Committee meeting on 28<sup>th</sup> September to talk to us about the ideas the Scouts have about their new building. The Committee appreciated that you wanted them to be involved at such an early stage. I have summarised the collected comments of the Cllrs below and hope they are of use to you.

#### **Cllr Comments**

Bishopstoke Parish Council wishes to support the principle of the scouts achieving a suitable replacement building that better meets their requirements.

The Parish is a consultee and will be asked for their views probably at the pre-application stage and when an application is submitted.

The "ideas" stage drawings would benefit from a site plan showing the footprint of the proposed building and external circulation space.

The proposal as shown takes up pretty much the full width of the site and the practicality of this needs to be thought through in terms of maintenance; emergency access; impacts on neighbours and the trees to the north of the site.

The Borough Council will require more information on access and parking. It would be worth checking with them to find out exactly what they need.

The site is near the Bishopstoke Conservation Area, so the Borough Council will probably ask their Heritage Consultant for their opinion on the design.

The Borough Council has a policy that non-residential buildings over a certain floor area threshold will need to achieve BREEAM Excellent. Check with the Planning department at the Borough Council for the current threshold and requirements.

When plans are further developed it is likely to be beneficial to keep the neighbours informed and onside as they will be consulted by the Borough Council when a planning application is submitted.

The Planning Committee, and Council as a whole wishes you well with your project. You have an open invitation to come back to the Planning Committee, and the Full Council if you wish, to present updates on your plans as they proceed.
